Extravaganza, which is our


major fund raiser and part of the annual Napa Valley Arts in April program.

The Never-Ending Gallery Story!

There's an old line about when something is over—and based on that, we haven't heard any singing at the Gallery!

Back in October, a number of issues converged to justify shutting down the Gallery at the end of 2014. First, there was a change in ownership and the new owner had different plans for the building. Then we recognized that a Gallery and Boutique didn't make economic sense, although classes might (and we didn't need all the space for classes).

After the Board decided to close the Gallery, a number of events developed. First, we started looking for a number of other locations, smaller in size and with an affordable price tag. We looked at several, and each one fell through either the building was going to be put up for sale, or it was too expensive, or it wasn't available for exclusive use.

Then, we heard from one person who was interested in renting some of the Gallery space. The new owner was willing to work with us; even some of our members were willing to help out financially for a few months.



Meanwhile, we needed to empty the building to make way for a New Year's Eve party, and because we told the

owner we'd be out in early January!

So now we're at another crossroads: do we rent out the two offices at both ends and keep the large gallery area for a ceramics program and a fine arts class and meeting room, recognizing that we will continue to lose money until we build up a strong class following. Or do we move on, and focus on fund raising that has proven successful in the past and use those proceeds to further our mission of supporting artists and the community?

At the upcoming Membership Meeting, we will have a general discussion on this topic. We need to hear from our members—yes, the Board makes the final decision, but something like this needs input from all.
