We will have several of our local artists displaying their works, some of which will be hung at the Center. Paintings, photography, jewelry and sculptures are just some of the items available.


The goal is to provide a venue for our member artists to show and sell their art to

Board Meetings

t their July meeting, the Board of Directors agreed to revisit our business plan, now that we no longer run the Gallery and Art Center. It is expected to

take 2-3 months to complete this project.

First, we need to review the market we operate in, and discuss the Strengths, Weaknesses Opportunities and Threats to the Foundation—a SWOT analysis, for short.

The next step is to verify what our mission to provide, and what we want to look like

in 5, 10 or 20 years, and what strategies we need to take to get there.

The final step is to take all of that and

condense it into a new business plan, including a program of events and services, operating budget, and plans for governing and marketing the Foundation.

We will begin this process at our next Board meeting,

scheduled for *Tuesday, August 11 at the* AC Library/Public Meeting room, starting and goals should be, what services we want at 7:00p.m. Members are encouraged to attend and participate.
