Job Descriptions are Coming!

It has been months in the making, but we are almost ready to review and adopt a limited number of job descriptions, that will better define roles and responsibilities between our volunteers.

And, although we can't offer any salaries, one each for the various special events we are also working on ways to say "Thank You" with more than just a smile! Extravaganza.

One of this year's goals was to write job descriptions for key positions, particularly relating to the Gallery. The Board will consider draft descriptions for the *Art Center Director* (formerly known as the Gallery Manager); the *Boutique Manager*; the *Gallery Manager* (focused on just the Fine Art Gallery, rather than the entire complex—hence the changed title for the Art Center Director); and the *Class Manager*. The latter two are new roles

that are very much needed, if we are going to have a successful Art Center.

We will also consider descriptions for *Gallery Assistants* (the volunteers that keep the doors open) and an *Event Chair*. There will likely be several Event Chairs, one each for the various special events that we produce, such as Winterfest or Art Extravaganza.

In addition to the descriptions, we will need to clarify who reports to whom, and what authority each position will have. And for some of the positions, we need to talk about what extra incentives we can offer—for example, perhaps we waive space rental charges or sales commissions for the Managers, or give them a free membership.

We'll report on the outcome in next month's Informer.
