Our 23rd Art Extravaganza

Come for the Art—Stay for the View... and the Wine!

fter all the work and worry, the 23rd annual *Art Extravaganza* Show and Sale is here! Or more specifically, at the *Jamieson Ranch Vineyards*. The show is ongoing from April 1-9, during winery hours. It is free and open to the public.

We received almost 120 entries from over 40 artists from the North Bay area. Over the

weekend our judges reviewed and thinned that list to 44 entries from 25 artists. You can get the listing online at

which will also include first, second and third place winners in each category.

Best in Show went to *Hilda C. Robinson*,

with her work entitled "Rapid Transit."

We have transformed the winery into an Art

Museum. In addition to the juried art, there are several exhibition pieces for sale, and Guest Artist, *Mario Chiodo*, has brought in dozens of his working models and sculptures, including some of his most recent works.

Mario will be speaking on April 8 at the winery. His talk is "From Monsters to

Monuments." And yes, there is an entire hallway full of his monster creations!

April 8 will also be our **Silent Auction and Reception** for our winning artists. JRV will host that reception.

And on Saturday, April 11, from 1-4 p.m. there will be tours of the
