


OPEN STUDIOS

e're kicking off our Fall Season of Art Classes, and we want to do it in style! You can sign up online or at the Gallery, starting August 20, and we will be holding our first ever


Class Registration Faire on Saturday, September 13, from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m., at the Gallery. Classes start the following week.

City considering a Public Arts Ordinance

fter hearing a presentation by Olivia Everett, CEO of the Arts Council Napa Valley, the City Council supported in concept an ordinance encouraging public art in American Canyon, similar to regulations adopted by Napa City and the Town of Yountville.
